I shared this a few weeks ago and being new to this committee, I'm not sure where these items would fall and if we would consider addressing?

#### **Proposed Talking Points for Agenda:**

#### 1. Community Plan (13 Years Old):

- The City of Yorkton's Community Plan is now 13 years old.
- Has the Planning & Infrastructure Commission (PII) revisited this plan to ensure we are meeting the benchmarks it originally set?
- If we are meeting the targets, are there any new plans to continue pushing progress forward (i.e., moving the goalposts)?
- If we are not meeting these targets, what corrective actions are being considered?

#### 2. Grain Millers Road – Project Scope & Responsibility:

- What is the full scope of the project along Grain Millers Road?
- Who holds responsibility for the sections of highway that run through the city limits?

#### 3. Bypass Planning & Traffic Flow:

- As truck traffic continues to grow with further development north of the city, has there been discussion around connecting the south and east highways to the north via a bypass outside of city limits?
- Is there any consideration to extend the 52A bypass to the south, ensuring it remains outside of city boundaries?

#### 4. Railway Infrastructure & Safety:

• Are there active conversations with railway companies regarding the expected increase in rail traffic?

- Are there options being explored to either:
  - Relocate rail lines outside of the city, or
  - Enhance the current infrastructure to allow trains to move more efficiently and safely through Yorkton?

#### 5. Highway 10 East – Condition & Access:

- The section of Highway 10 East of Yorkton is in poor condition and in need of attention.
- Additionally, there are two service roads in the area that require improvements or expansions but these might be RM.

#### 6. Pedestrian Safety - Sidewalk by Canadian Tire:

- Consideration should be given to adding a sidewalk along the north side of Canadian Tire, connecting to the pathway south of Broadway.
- This is a key pedestrian safety concern.

#### 7. Dracup & Smith – Future Community Facility:

• Could the City consider acquiring land along Dracup and Smith for the potential future development of a multipurpose facility or field house?

#### 8. New Hospital Location:

- Does the current Community Plan account for major infrastructure such as the proposed new hospital?
- Who ultimately decides where the new hospital is located?
- Is there potential to strategically relocate the hospital to a new site where a supporting development (e.g., residential, commercial) could be built around it?
- The existing hospital location could then potentially be repurposed for additional residential development.

#### 9. Sully Road:

• Is the talk true about opening up this roadway? To connect highway 16 to highway 52?
